PURPOSE

To provide parents/carers and other members of our school community with an overview of The Currajong School's approach to fundraising.

POLICY

Fundraising is an important way for The Currajong School to raise money so that it can deliver additional learning opportunities, programs for students and improve school amenities.

School staff, members of the school community or the Parents' Association may want to undertake fundraising activities for The Currajong School.

The Currajong School encourages all members of our school community to be involved in fundraising initiatives and the Principal welcomes all proposals for fundraising.

At the beginning of each school year, the Leadership Team will approve any fundraising events or activities for the upcoming year.

In deciding whether or not to approve particular fundraising events or activities, the Leadership Team will act in accordance with legal requirements, policies or guidelines.

Fundraising for Charitable Causes

The Currajong School may also decide to fundraise for charitable causes. In deciding whether or not to fundraise for a particular charitable cause, the Principal may:

- consider whether the methods used to raise funds for any specific charitable appeal are appropriate; and
- seek written advice from organisations promoting fundraising activities on the percentage of funds raised that are directed to the named charity.
