

## **ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES POLICY**

The Currajong School takes a zero-tolerance approach to child abuse and is fully committed to ensuring that its strategies, policies, procedures and practices meet all **Child Safe Standards as specified in Ministerial Order No.** 1359 (2022)

## **DEFINITION**

An adventure activity is an activity that involves greater than normal risk and may involve:

- travel into an area of the country in which vehicle contact is difficult and/or uncertain
- confrontation with natural environmental challenges requiring greater reliance upon personal resources than would normally be required in day-today life
- less than normal contact, by person or by telephone, with medical and other public services available in day-to-day life
- exposure to the natural elements with less than the normal physical protection provided in day-to-day life

Activities considered to be Adventure activities may include:

- abseiling walls/ artificial climbing
- bush walking/orienteering
- canoeing/kayaking
- recreational swimming/surfing
- o challenge ropes courses
- cycling
- horse riding

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES**

Adventure activities require the prior written approval of the Principal and must follow all planning, approval and consent guidelines in The Currajong School's policy document 'Excursions and Off-Site Activities' with consideration given to the following factors:

- planning and approvals
- venue selection
- safety, emergency and risk management
- informed consent from parents
- medical information

- appropriate staffing and supervision
- transportation
- student preparation and behaviour support plans
- requirements for specific adventure activities
- Child safe practices
- Occupational health and safety
- Covid safe management plans

In addition to The Currajong School's own risk assessment, a further risk assessment, as well as proof of relevant insurances, should be provided by any organisation specialising in adventure activities engaged by the School.
